


Dear Friends in Christ,

The morning of the resurrection, Jesus met two women at the tomb and told them to “go and tell” (Matthew 28:10). What were they supposed to go and tell? That Jesus was with them: “Do not be afraid.” He said, “Go and tell my brothers to go to Galilee; there they will see me.” Apart from the women, Jesus’ disciples hadn’t seen, felt or heard His presence, but He wasn’t dead. He wanted them to know that He was with them.



The Gospels tells us that not all of them believed it right away. Why?

They were certainly overwhelmed with everything that had happened. Looking at everything through the lenses of the here-and-now, it was hard to focus on what Jesus had taught them and what God had witnessed to people in the Scriptures over thousands of years.

For example, they had just celebrated the Passover. On the first Passover each Hebrew household sacrificed a perfect yearling lamb and sprinkled the blood on the crosspiece and sideposts of the door. The Angel of Death passed over the houses which were protected by the blood of the lamb. At the time, they couldn’t see the connection to Christ’s death on the cross, but later Peter wrote, “*You were saved... with the precious blood of Christ, who was like a pure and perfect lamb*” 1 Peter 1:18-19 (NCV).

“For what I received I passed on to you as of first importance: that Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures, ⁴ that he was buried, that he was raised on the third day according to the Scriptures, ⁵ and that he appeared to Peter, and then to the Twelve. ⁶ After that, he appeared to more than five hundred of the brothers at the same time, most of whom are still living, though some have fallen asleep”
1 Corinthians 15:3-6 (NIV).

Then, during the Passover, they had celebrated the Feast of Unleavened Bread. For this feast, they cleaned their houses thoroughly, got rid of all leaven, and ate only unleavened bread. The apostle Paul a devout Pharisee at that time would have done that. Later as a Christian he wrote, “*Christ, our Passover lamb, has been sacrificed. ⁸ Therefore let us keep the Festival, not with the old yeast, the yeast of malice and wickedness, but with bread without yeast, the bread of sincerity and truth*” 1 Corinthians 5:7-8 (NIV)

Then also, on the day of Christ’s resurrection was the Feast of the Firstfruits. “Firstfruits” refers to the first portion of the harvest. The Feast of Firstfruits was instituted when the people was still wandering, without land or crops. It was observed in faith that God would lead the people to the land He had promised. I’m sure at the time they couldn’t see the connection to Christ, but later on the apostle Paul writes, “*But Christ has indeed been raised from the dead, the firstfruits of those who have fallen asleep*” 1 Corinthians 15:20 (NIV)

They couldn’t connect any of this at the time. Later however, when Jesus personally met them, He “*opened their minds so they could understand the Scriptures. ⁴⁶ He told them, ‘This is what is written: The Christ will suffer and rise from the dead on the third day’*” Luke 24:45-46 (NIV).

There are times when God just has to open our eyes to see that He’s got everything under control. Faith in Christ is meaningless without the promises of God’s Word. Even though we do not personally see, feel or hear Him. He speaks to us in His Word. He is risen and He is near to you. The women thought they were alone, just as we might think we are alone at times, but it’s not true. (continued next page)

Life is full of uncertainties, but no matter what happens, God wants you to know and believe that His promises can't fail. Understanding this is a matter of coming to knowing the Word of God and trusting the living Lord to do what He has promised. For the women at the tomb, it meant going and telling the rest of the disciples that Jesus had risen. For them and the rest of the disciples it meant going to Galilee and not being afraid. Where is God challenging you to trust in what He says? To not be afraid, to be at peace, to serve others in love, to grow in the knowledge of His Word. Following Jesus' word and trusting in God's promises is what was important for the disciples then and is that same for us now. As Christ did then may the Spirit inspire us to trust in the promises and be assured of God's presence with us. He has risen indeed!



Shipwrecked—Rescued by Jesus!
June 18-22, 6-8 pm
VBS Celebration BBQ and
Concert by the Watoto Children's Choir on Friday, 22nd**

Our most important resource need for VBS is people. God uses His people (that's us!) to love children and to bring them to Jesus. Please keep VBS in mind as you plan for the summer. Teaching VBS with the curriculum we use is designed to be easy. Everything is planned and laid out for you. Group sizes are small. We use both teachers and helpers for each group, so no teacher is leading alone. Lessons are only 15 minutes long.

Of course, we all have different gifts and abilities, and not everyone will be able to teach. If that's the case for you, there are many ways you can still help with VBS:

- Begin praying now for the children and families that will be impacted by the gospel message through our VBS. Pray for God to work powerfully through us.
- Think about people you could invite to VBS and places you could place/distribute advertising flyers. Make a list!
- Volunteer to help with: registration and attendance, providing and serving snacks, running the video and sound desk, serving in our closing celebration BBQ on Friday.
- Begin putting aside items you may have that we could borrow for the set we will create (see list below)

Our theme this year is "Shipwrecked-Rescued by Jesus." Our set will have a tropical island theme. Some of the things we will be looking to borrow or use to create our set are:

- Artificial tropical greenery (palms, ferns, palm leaves, tropical flowers, tropical plants)
- Natural color rope for building a castaways' shelter
- Carpet tubes for creating palm trees and our castaways' shelter (the sooner we get these the better, since other churches will be looking for them too. We could easily use 8-10.)
- Rustic wood boxes/crates
- Old-fashioned lanterns like what might be used on a ship (decorative, does not have to work)
- Tiki torches, clean and decorative (We will not be lighting them)
- Sea chests/foot-lockers/old-fashioned suitcases for ship travel
- Large anchor and chain
- Raffia/bamboo décor (curtains, mats/garland)
- Life preserver décor
- Large stuffed animals or posters/pictures of: sea gulls, parrots, toucans, sea turtles, sting rays, sloths, monkeys, green lizards, tropical ocean fish
- Sea shells, sand dollars, sea stars, sea glass
- Fish net décor

The River Will Rise



Elder Chairman's Message

In my haste to meet last month's newsletter deadline, I failed to attach all the correct documents for Marianne. What follows was my intended article, which still rings as true this month. Enjoy...

The rain just kept falling. It fell for a solid week across the Midwest and in our area, with stretches of heavy rain. With the sun completely hidden most of the time, you could scarcely tell what time of day it was without sneaking a peek at the clock. The WCIA-3 weather guys - Kevin, Jack & Adam all had a pretty repetitive routine—morning showers, followed by strong winds and rain all day and into the night with periods of heavy rain. They would occasionally add in the “wintry mix” comment, but with temperatures so warm, it wouldn't stick. Low lying areas have a high potential for flooding. Rivers and streams will completely fill, and widespread flooding is expected as the storm continues into the weekend.



I didn't see a rainbow when these storms ended, but recalled God's Old Testament promise to Noah. We could watch the Sangamon River rise right behind our house. As the banks overflowed and the flooding continued, eventually the river became part of the back yard. You know its close when you can “hear the river” flowing through the tall timber, and making all sorts of splashing, bubbling, rushing and gurgling sounds. Occasionally there's a loud crack & splash as a tree or large limb meets its demise. I've grown somewhat used to it, after living beside the river since 2005. The sights and sounds of the river are equally impressive when there's thick ice on top, (but that's another story).



At first glance you see the flood water has covered every inch of land in its path. Next you make an assessment of how deep it is, by how much of the tree trunks or other landmarks are covered. You can see bubbles, branches, and the surging current racing downstream. It seems like a relentlessly powerful event for which you have front row seats, but no control of at all.

If we take to heart some of Pastor Shawn's teaching from his Feb. 21st Lenten sermon (which was to *be still*) and really listen, then God can speak rather clearly to us. (See *Mark 6:30-34*) Take time out from the hustle and bustle of the day, and relax. Get away from things for a while, even if it's just for a few minutes, and refuel your spiritual batteries. In those “be still” times, the river of your life may represent many different things, some helpful and others not. Seek Jesus and ask for his guidance and comfort, and wait patiently on Him, as he reveals his plan for you and your life here, in this place, at this time. (continued next page)

What does a river represent to you? God's love and grace flows from him like a River. His river is unstoppable. His river has no end. His river continues forever. Don't be afraid to get into your "faith boat," and take your lifelong journey in God's River. It's the only river that leads to eternal life with our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.

Billy Graham, perhaps the world's most well know modern evangelist, passed away on February 22nd at the age of 99. Billy said "Being a Christian is more than just an instantaneous conversion - it is a daily process whereby you grow to be more and more like Christ". Billy Graham boldly proclaimed God's Grace and Christ Crucified. He also said "My home is in Heaven. I'm just traveling through this world." I believe Billy was a servant of the Lord, who followed the Lord's call, to be an instrument whereby those who heard God's word, could be moved and transformed by the Holy Spirit. May we all continue to grow to be more like Christ, until that day when our life's river excursion ends, and we step out of our faith boat, to meet him at our heavenly home.
