Trinity is excited to host the Watoto Children's Choir! The choir consists of a group of 18 orphans from Uganda who will be touring the United States for six months. **The concert date is Friday, June 22nd at 6:00 pm.** The concert will feature worship songs that share the stories of the children and the joy that they have because of God's love. The children will tell how their lives have been changed and how they have been called into a life of purpose to transform their communities.

In 1994, Watoto Church founded Watoto Child Care Ministry, Inc., an international holistic care program that was begun as a response to the overwhelming number of orphaned and vulnerable children and women in Uganda. It is positioned to rescue an individual and raise each one as a leader in his or her chosen sphere of life so that they in turn will help rebuild their nation. The program involves physical care, medical intervention including HIV/AIDS treatment, education – formal and vocational, and counseling and emotional well-being as well as moral and spiritual discipleship.

Since 1994, Watoto Children's Choirs have traveled the world sharing the plight of Africa's orphaned children. Each child in the choir has suffered the loss of one or both of his or her parents but has been rescued and now lives in a Watoto village. Watoto is a holistic child-care solution initiated to serve the dire needs of the children of Africa.

The Watoto Children's Choir will arrive on Friday, June 22nd in the early afternoon. The children will present their concert Friday evening and then leave on Saturday morning. **We are looking for 9-10 host families, who could open their homes to 1-3 children and a chaperone.** It is a delightful and loving way to help. Trinity will provide a meal for the children prior to the concert. The host families will take their guests home after the concert. Host families will need to provide a breakfast and a sack lunch for their guests. The host families will bring their guests back to Trinity on Saturday morning (time to be determined). **We will also need volunteers to help unload the equipment on Friday afternoon, usher at the concert, assist in selling promotional materials before and after the concert, and pack equipment after the concert. Please look for a host sign-up sheet and other volunteer sheets in the Narthex in the near future.**

We are looking forward to an inspirational and beautiful evening of song, dance, and fellowship. - Many of the homeless do not have access to dental care, so avoid food items that are difficult to chew. This includes:
Crunchy trail mix and hard granola bars
- Strong smelling toiletries; even if packaged separately, the smell will leak through to the food
- Anything made of glass, which is easily broken
- Cash is often not the greatest blessing.

**June 18-22, 6-8 pm —VBS Celebration BBQ
Concert by the Watoto Children's Choir on Friday, 22nd**



Our most important resource need for VBS is people. God uses His people (that's us!) to love children and to bring them to Jesus. Please keep VBS in mind as you plan for the summer. Teaching VBS with the curriculum we use is designed to be easy. Everything is planned and laid out for you. Group sizes are small. We use both teachers and helpers for each group, so no teacher is leading alone. Lessons are only 15 minutes long.

Of course, we all have different gifts and abilities, and not everyone will be able to teach. If that's the case for you, there are many ways you can still help with VBS:

- Begin praying now for the children and families that will be impacted by the gospel message through our VBS. Pray for God to work powerfully through us.
- Think about people you could invite to VBS and places you could place/distribute advertising flyers. Make a list!
- Volunteer to help with: registration and attendance, providing and serving snacks, running the video and sound desk, serving in our closing celebration BBQ on Friday.
- Begin putting aside items you may have that we could borrow for the set we will create (see list below)

Our theme this year is "Shipwrecked-Rescued by Jesus." Our set will have a tropical island theme. Some of the things we will be looking to borrow or use to create our set are:

- Artificial tropical greenery (palms, ferns, palm leaves, tropical flowers, tropical plants)
- Natural color rope for building a castaways' shelter
- Carpet tubes for creating palm trees and our castaways' shelter (the sooner we get these the better, since other churches will be looking for them too. We could easily use 8-10.)
- Rustic wood boxes/crates
- Old-fashioned lanterns like what might be used on a ship (decorative, does not have to work)
- Tiki torches, clean and decorative (We will not be lighting them)
- Sea chests/foot-lockers/old-fashioned suitcases for ship travel
- Large anchor and chain
- Raffia/bamboo décor (curtains, mats/garland)
- Life preserver décor
- Large stuffed animals or posters/pictures of: sea gulls, parrots, toucans, sea turtles, sting rays, sloths, monkeys, green lizards, tropical ocean fish
- Sea shells, sand dollars, sea stars, sea glass
- Fish net décor
