

Dear Members and Friends of Trinity,

Prayer is one of the great privileges that we have in Christ. There are some verses in the book of Hebrews that show us how special prayer really is. *“Therefore, since we have a great high priest who has gone through the heavens, Jesus the Son of God, let us hold firmly to the faith we profess. <sup>15</sup> For we do not have a high priest who is unable to sympathize with our weaknesses, but we have one who has been tempted in every way, just as we are—yet was without sin. <sup>16</sup> So let us come boldly to the throne of our gracious God. There we will receive his mercy, and we will find grace to help us when we need it most.”* Hebrews 4:14-16 (NIV).

We all have weaknesses that we need to be praying about. But what I’d like for us to think about, as a church, is also praying for others. What a wonderful promise that we can take the needs of others to the throne of our gracious God and He will give mercy and help when we need it most.

What I’d like us to think about from now until Thanksgiving is 1-1-1 prayer. It’s something all of us can easily do, and it’s a real blessing for the people that we’re praying for. I heard about this a couple of decades ago and have put it into practice from time to time. I shared this at church, and what I’m asking everyone to do is pray: for 1 person for 1 minute at 1pm every day. The one person for one minute part is pretty easy. The one o’clock part may be challenging depending on your work schedule or other commitments, but the main thing is that we reserve one minute a day to pray for one person.

Isn’t it an amazing thing that we can boldly come to the throne of our gracious God? Jesus explained, *“I am not saying that I will ask the Father on your behalf. <sup>27</sup> No, the Father himself loves you because you have loved me and have believed that I came from God”* John 16:26-27 (NIV). This is pretty amazing!

It is absolutely true that our sins have separated us from God. (Isaiah 59:2), and it’s true that no human can approach the Father except through Jesus’ blood (Hebrews 10:19-20). Jesus intercedes for us (Romans 8:34; Hebrews 7:25). He is our advocate with the Father (1 John 2:1), and our High Priest before the throne of God (Hebrews 4:14-15). All these things He is doing right now for us so that we can boldly come. Basically He’s saying, “I want you to take your requests directly to God. He loves you. He wants you to come. He is not angry at you.” The Father’s heart is open to us. That’s what Jesus means in saying, “For the Father himself loves you.”

As we engage in this together, let us pray that by God’s grace we’d *“hold firmly to the faith we profess.”* Pray for one special person, somebody that you know: a neighbor, a friend, a family member. Pray for yourself that God would use you as salt and light in their life. Pray for them that God would open their eyes to their need for a Savior. Pray to the Father with expectancy. Consider that there might not be anyone else in the world praying for that person (except for Jesus). God loves to give mercy and grace, and *“because of Christ and our faith in him, we can now come boldly and confidently into God’s presence.”* Ephesians 3:12 (NLT).

### President's Report

Parish Council August 21, 2018

At the **May 6, 2018** Voters' Meeting, I presented the Cornerstone Committee report, which summarized the space needs and aspirations of the congregation. Chuck Reifsteck described the approach taken by the Cornerstone Committee. I lead the discussion about forming a building committee with members that have varied experience and expertise.

The objectives of the building committee are:

- To use the Cornerstone Committee report as a starting point;
- To seek advice from the Property Management Committee;
- To propose a comprehensive plan to the congregation on our space needs, an estimate of the cost for a building project, and financing options; and
- To bring a report on its recommendations to the congregation for consideration.

Beginning **July 17, 2018**, the building Committee has established a biweekly meeting schedule and a timeline for completing a report on its progress to the congregation. In my opinion, the members of the Building Committee are doing a very good job as they diligently study the issues. Dave Kuehn deserves our special thanks for his leadership as chair of the committee.

In fact, the Building Committee is doing so well that I believe they may well reach a consensus on many key aspects of a building plan, cost estimates, and possible financing options for a building project by September.

Therefore, we have scheduled a joint meeting of the Parish and Ministry Councils on **October 8, 2018** to review the anticipated progress report from the Building Committee. If approved by the Councils, the next step would be to present a report for consideration by and for input from the congregation at the Voters' Meeting on **November 4, 2018**. The anticipated report from the Building Committee is not expected be a final report, rather the report would be on the committee's progress so far.

Under our Constitution, the congregation must approve any final building plan that includes the erection of a building.

"In all matters affecting ...the erection of any building by the congregation, at least one-half (1/2) of the voting members must be present, and a two-thirds (2/3) majority of those present is required to pass a resolution."

Excerpt from Trinity's Constitution, Art. IX

This means a final building plan can only be approved by a super-majority of the congregation voting in favor of the plan; then, and only then, would a plan be approved.

Glad to discuss.

**LWML is collecting school kits for children** whose lives have been disrupted by war or some other disaster.


Receiving a school kit is a sign that someone far away cares. Adults in literacy classes appreciate the supplies needed to learn to read and write.
