

Dear members and friends of Trinity,

What comes to mind when you think of the word “church?” When the word “church” is used in the Bible it’s used in two different ways. First it’s used to refer to every Christian who’s ever lived throughout history. That’s called the universal church. Every believer all around the world regardless of the denominational label, regardless of whether they’re in a church building or not, every believer wherever they are, around the world, is part of the universal church.

But the other way the word “church” is used is to refer to a local group, a specific place. Like the church at Corinth, the church that met in Lydia’s home, the church that met in Philemon’s home or like our church, Trinity, that meets in Urbana.



*“The Spirit himself testifies with our spirit that we are God’s children.”* Romans 8:16 (NIV)

Almost every time you see the word “church” in the Bible it’s used to refer to a specific group of believers like our fellowship at Trinity. It’s like when you were born physically, you were automatically entered into the human race, but then at the same time you became part of a family too. You didn’t stay in the hospital. The way that God designed things is for us to become part of a family and for a family to become part of us. The Bible refers to the church as a family:

*“Consequently, you are no longer foreigners and aliens, but fellow citizens with God’s people and members of God’s household,<sup>20</sup> built on the foundation of the apostles and prophets, with Christ Jesus himself as the chief cornerstone”* Ephesians 2:19-20 (NIV)

Sometimes we think church is about “doing” something—but I think it has more to do with “being.” If church is more like a family in God’s eyes, then aspects of our character as God’s beloved children in Christ—like loving, forgiving, accepting and encouraging one another would be most important for believers (see also Galatians 6:22-26 or Colossians 3:12-17 where the Word describes “being” in Christ). In the Christian community, the problem is that we can be really good at “doing” and not so good at “being.”

*“And this is God’s plan: Both Gentiles and Jews who believe the Good News share equally in the riches inherited by God’s children. Both are part of the same body, and both enjoy the promise of blessings because they belong to Christ Jesus.”* Ephesians 3:6 (NLT)

Throughout the Bible, it’s interesting that the Lord calls us to “Be” before he calls us to “Do.” The Scriptures remark about the *righteousness* of men like Abraham and Noah before it tells the stories of what they *accomplished*. Certainly they stumbled from time to time – we all do that – but their primary concern wasn’t accomplishment, it was their relationship with God.

*The lesson?* Who you are is far more important in the eyes of God than what you accomplish. Jesus said: *“What good is it for a man to gain the whole world, yet forfeit his soul?”* Mark 8:36 (NIV). As we study through the book of James on Sundays, I’m impressed by how much James concentrates on Christian character. I’m so glad for God’s patience and love to us in Christ. Let our hearts and minds and faith focus on “being.” For I believe that will make our “doing” something of real value to God.

The objectives of the building committee are –

- To use the Cornerstone Committee report as a starting point;
- To seek advice from the Property Management Committee;
- To propose a comprehensive plan to the congregation on our space needs, an estimate of the cost for a building project, and financing options; and
- To bring a report on its recommendations to the congregation for consideration.

The Building Committee diligently preparing key aspects of a building plan, cost estimates, and possible financing options for a building project. The committee meets again on **October 1, 2018**.

As I told you last month, the Parish and Ministry Councils will meet jointly on **October 8, 2018** to review the anticipated progress report from the Building Committee.

If approved by the Councils, the next step would be to present a report for consideration by and for input from the congregation at the Voters' Meeting on **November 4, 2018**.

The anticipated report from the Building Committee will not be a final report, rather the report will be on the committee's progress so far.

Under our Constitution, the congregation must approve any final building plan that includes the erection of a building.

*In all matters affecting ...the erection of any building by the congregation, at least one-half (1/2) of the voting members must be present, and a two-thirds (2/3) majority of those present is required to pass a resolution.*

Excerpt from Trinity's Constitution, Art. IX

This means a final building plan can only be approved by a super-majority of the congregation voting in favor of the plan; then, and only then, would a plan be approved.

**The ARK Encounter**



The Ark Is Amazing! What took Noah over one of our lifetimes to build has been replicated over a 2 year construction time. Noah and his family were completely committed and dedicated to pleasing God and doing what he commanded. It was a century long, larger than life testament of Noah's faith. The Ark was also the only safe haven for all who would give up their wicked ways and repent. In the Genesis account, only 8 human lives were saved, Noah's family including his wife, 3 sons and their wives. I've rarely considered it, but we are all descendants of Noah. (See Genesis 6-9)

About 4350 years after the Flood ([answersingenesis.org](http://answersingenesis.org)), and 2 millennia after Christ's coming, we still seek signs from God. He told us that never again would he destroy the world with a flood. On September 8 & 9, 2018 during our rainy commute to and from Kentucky, something occurred to all of us. The safest place to be during a flood was in the protection of an ark, built to the exact specifications given by God. Rainfall totals for a 48 hour period around the Cincinnati metro area during our visit were over 10 inches and counting.

Our group traveled in separate vehicles and after checking into our hotel in Cincinnati, OH, continued south to the Ark Encounter in Williamstown, KY. It was everything we expected and more! The brochures and even pictures don't compare to the experience. It is massive, and contains everything that was needed for the animals and Noah's family to live, work, and rest, while caring for all the animals God had brought to the Ark. For a firsthand account of our experiences at the Ark or the Creation Museum in Petersburg, KY just ask one of us about it. Trinity travelers during this expedition included Mike & Betty Strom, Dave & Maxine Kuehn, Bob & Nina Frank, Dee Dee Williams, Courtney Boriff, Fred & Jennifer Holhubner, & myself.

I tend to think that Noah and his family were the only ones who did any of the work of building the Ark. It, however, makes sense that he would have employed the help of others in the region as needed, and as depicted during part of our Ark Encounter. Only Noah and the other seven (7) were firmly committed to this task and understood God's plan for the Ark. (See: Gen 6:13-22) All others wondered what was wrong with Noah. This was crazy! Building a huge 3 story ship, on the top of a mountain! Even the animals showing up 2-by-2 didn't persuade even one (1) sinner to change their ways, and repent. Noah's wisdom and obedience to God's commands would appear foolish until it was too late, and the world was completely submerged!

Everyone was impressed by the size, scale & details of the Ark! It is after all 510 ft. long x 85 ft. wide x 51 ft. high and required 3.3 million board feet of timber. I believe the 11 of us from Trinity, who traveled in the rain to see this recreation, were amazed. It exceeded all expectations! Even today, it is the largest timber frame structure IN THE WORLD! Entire logs make up main support posts from top to bottom. Every detail was meticulously considered, planned for, and executed in the construction of the Ark. Feeding, watering and cleanup chores for the animals were all planned out. Living and sleeping quarters for Noah's family were also not forgotten. Imagine doing all your chores on board a boat that left total destruction for an unknown destination, with only your family and a lot of needy animals on board. How could you do those chores? My guess is, that you might do them gladly, knowing that the word of God was spoken to you and your family directly. You were given those chores, for God's glory! You are to go forth and multiply and fill the earth with your offspring. You are to raise your family, knowing that he has entrusted his entire creation to your family. You have been chosen, by God, to do his work.

All was provided for in God's time, as he saw fit. There were no stowaways on board. Everyone and everything that was supposed to be saved physically at that time was saved. Human life was saved in body and spirit. This was a new chapter in our existence. God spoke to Noah and kept him from destruction. Now, God continuously encourages us to follow his Son and turn from our wicked ways. We have so many gifts, freely given by our heavenly father, but we go astray, just like the people of Noah's day. God assures us whenever a rainbow emerges, that never again will he destroy the world with a flood. While we know he is supremely in control, he also loves each and every one of us as his own child. He wants us to remain close to him, and trust His word and His Son.

May God's word and the Gospel of Jesus Christ comfort us in our own stormy times. May we all climb aboard God's Ark, and enjoy the work that our loving Savior Jesus Christ has prepared for us. I pray that we also share the good news of Christ Jesus, and beckon others to accept Jesus into their lives.




### Youth Alpha

Trinity will again be having the Pumpkin Patch fundraiser to support local and international outreach.

We receive the pumpkins grown on Navajo Indian land in New Mexico, and this project employs Navajo people. We take the pumpkins on consignment with no upfront costs. We are not are not responsible for any unsold pumpkins or any loss due to spoilage or theft.

We keep a percentage of everything we sell—last year that was just over \$1400. These proceeds go to the Haiti Feeding program, Rural Alaskan Mission work, Operation Christmas Child and Eastern Illinois Food Bank.

This year the Pumpkin Patch will be open **October 14<sup>th</sup>-31<sup>st</sup>**. Thank you to everyone that helped last year! Please step up again this year—we can't do it without you! Here some ways that you can help:

### *Oh, NO! Stress! Stress! Stress! Stress!*

No individual is above being stressed, that is what makes us human, but the ability to tackle stress makes one a conqueror. Stress according to The American Institution of Stress is, "a condition or feeling experienced when a person perceives that demands exceed the personal and social resources the individual is able to mobilize."

**Alarm stage:** this is fight or flight. Here the hormones are released in high levels which in turns increase the heart rate, respiration rate, blood pressure etc.

**Second stage:** Resistance, here the body returns to its normal state, but if the stressor persists the body goes into the final stage of stress.

**Exhaustion:** the final stage of stress, this is when the body has used up its energy and can no longer cope with stressors, death could result.

Stress Contributes and affects life style behaviors that increases as individual's risk for:

- Sudden death
- Heart attack
- Diabetes
- Hypertension
- Depression
- Insomnia
- Anything could cause stress to an individual.

Warning signs of stress:

- Problems eating or sleeping
- Use of alcohol or other substances such as sedatives, sleep enhancers
- Problems making decisions
- Persistent anger or hostile feelings
- Inability to concentrate
- Increased boredom
- Frequent headaches and ailment

What to do when stressed:

- Pray
- Exercise
- Treat yourself to healthy foods that you enjoy
- Go swimming
- Practice deep breathing
- Listen to music
- Engage in activities you enjoy
- Get a massage
