What barriers did Jesus' disciples have in believing? And like them, what barriers do you and I face in trusting and following Jesus? I've found encouragement in my faith by looking at how Jesus connected with John the Baptist. You may be facing one of the barriers he did, right now. Or you may be helping someone who is facing one of these barriers. They're common to everyone. The message of Jesus Christ and the love of Jesus Christ can reach us in spite of the challenges that all of us face in following Him.



The scripture seems to say that John may have never met Jesus. Or, if he had, since Jesus was his cousin, John still didn't know Jesus as the Messiah. For John said, "I myself did not know him, but the reason I came baptizing with water was that he might be revealed to Israel." John 1:31 & 33 (NIV)

I find comfort in the fact that John didn't have all the answers. What thought in your heart and mind calms you when you're stressed? Is it from God? It sounds too ridiculously simple to say, "Just trust God." So let's explore the faith of John the Baptist for a minute. How did Christ personally reach out to him? What barriers did John have in believing and how is he like you and me?

The ruler Herod (who was actually the son of the Herod who was ruling when Jesus was born) imprisoned John and ended up beheading him, because John told Herod it was wrong for him marry his half-brother's wife, along with all the other evil things he was doing.

But John wrestled with believing that Jesus was the way even though he heard God the Father's voice speaking from heaven saying to Jesus, "You are My beloved Son, in whom I am well pleased." Mark 1:11 (NKJV), and he "saw the Spirit come down from heaven in the form of a dove and rest on him." John 1:32–33 (NCV)

Just after the baptism, John was put in prison. Whether you've been in a literal prison doesn't really matter, we've all dealt with limitations, hassles, problems and hurts that have scarred us. Things in our lives that seem to chain us down. Things that cause us to have a negative point of view towards somebody else or our work that we have to do or even ourselves. Sometimes a person might even wonder if God is with them in the struggle.

The point is that as we follow Christ in this world we're not exempt from suffering. And I find great comfort in the great John the Baptist; one in seeing that he too doubted, and two, in seeing how Jesus lovingly encouraged Him. For example, while John "was in prison, [he] heard about all the things the Messiah was doing. So he sent his disciples to ask Jesus, 3 "Are you the Messiah we've been expecting, or should we keep looking for someone else?" Matthew 11:2-3 (NIV).

"Jesus told John's disciples, 'Go back to John and tell him what you have heard and seen—5 the blind see, the lame walk, those with leprosy are cured, the deaf hear, the dead are raised to life, and the Good News is being preached to the poor." 6 And he added, "God blesses those who do not fall away because of me." Matthew 11:4-6 (NIV).

The connection that Jesus makes in this text is patience and compassion with someone who already believes and is serving God with all his heart. There are times in your Christian life when you are down. You are troubled about what you're going through, and a connection with Jesus through the Word, at those times, will bring you out of the confusion and back into the light of Christ.

What was the barrier that John had and that Christ had to overcome? The barrier was doubt. The doubt centered on not believing "that in all things God works for the good of those who love him, who have been called according to his purpose" Romans 8:28 (NIV).



Notice, and I think this is the key application point for us as believers, that John reached out to Jesus and Jesus responded immediately. From John's perspective, he had an intolerable wait sitting in a prison of doubt and a literal prison cell too. But in reality, which John could only see by faith, the answer and encouragement from God was swift in that Jesus responded right away. Here's a good verse to memorize: "Before they call I will answer; while they are still speaking I will hear." Isaiah 65:24 (NIV)

Faith in Christ is greater than your circumstances and God's love for you in Jesus is unstoppable. Don't miss the beautiful encouragement that God had placed in John's heart: Jesus "the Lamb of God,



who takes away the sin of the world!" John 1:29 (NIV) A very simple message that encourages a believer to "not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. 7 And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus." Philippians 4:6–7 (NIV)
