Dear Trinity Members and Friends in Christ,

It's a challenging time for all of us. I'd like to share some biblical insights that can help us receive perspective and peace from our God who is in control of all things, and from our Savior who gives us peace that the world cannot give. So, let's con-



sider what the Bible would tell us in situations like we find ourselves in today, when we struggle to adjust to many changes in our lives, when we feel worried and stressed about things that are out of our control, and when we are not free to meet together as we are used to.

I think of the wonderful clip we saw from the movie, "Risen," when Bartholomew was threatened by the Roman officer, saying, "I could have you killed," and Bartholomew laughed and knelt down saying, "Strike." Then he said, "What do you have to fear from us? Our only weapon is love." How true this is! Jesus defeated sin and Satan with love. He won our salvation by losing. How freeing this is to us! We don't need to fear anything. "If God is for us, who can be against us? He who did not spare His own Son, but delivered Him up for us all, how shall He not with Him also freely give us all things? Who can separate us from the love of Christ? Shall tribulation or distress or persecution or famine, or nakedness, or peril, or sword? In all these things we are more than conquerors through Him who loved us." (Romans 8:31b, 32, 35, 37b)



When Pilate asked Jesus, "Are you the King of the Jews?" Jesus replied, "My Kingdom is not of this world. If My Kingdom were of this world, My servants would fight, so that I should not be delivered to the Jews." (John 18:33, 36) and later, "Pilate said to Him, "Are You not speaking to me? Do you not know that I have power to crucify You, and power to release you?" Jesus answered, "You could have not power at all against Me unless it had been given to you from above." (John 19:10-11). Our God is in control. His Kingdom is the everlasting Kingdom, and He has made us citizens of His Kingdom!

The apostle Paul, when he was kept in prison unjustly,

trusted in God, and used the time to write letters of encouragement to the churches and to share the gospel of Jesus Christ with his captors. He penned these immortal words to his coworker Timothy: "Remember that Jesus Christ, of the seed of David, was raised from the dead according to my gospel, 9 for which I suffer trouble as an evildoer, even to the point of chains; but the word of God is not chained" (2 Timothy 2:8-9).

For us, also, the word of God is not chained. We have live-streamed worship services each Sunday online; I'm writing and posting Bible studies on our church website, as well as recordings of the Sunday services. And we are worshiping at church; we have at least six Communion services each week, meeting in groups of ten. Bible study groups are meeting online too. And rest assured, Ministry Council, Parish Council, and Elders are working on plans to open up more ministry as soon as we are able.



I will close with some good principles for us to follow from 1 Timothy, chapter 2, where Paul writes: "I urge, then, first of all, that petitions, prayers, intercession and thanksgiving be made for all people—<sup>2</sup> for kings and all those in authority, that we may live peaceful and quiet lives in all godliness and holiness. <sup>3</sup> This is good, and pleases God our Savior, who wants all people to be saved and to come to a



knowledge of the truth" (1 Timothy 2:1-4, NIV). I look forward to the time when we can meet together in larger groups at the church. Until then, let's continue to trust in God and to grow in love and patience.

We've "Zoomed" with them a few times which is great to see them, and surely saves a lot of driving! My point is that we want to see them in person, but we can't right now. We can't even take a vacation and drive or fly to see them in person. We must rely on available technology, and schedule time to gather the whole bunch on-screen like a rerun of the Brady Bunch. While Brenda & I really appreciate that reference, I'm sure the kids don't see themselves the same way we do when we're on screen.

I consider myself a relatively patient person for most things, but just knowing that we can't pick up and drive or fly to see our kids leaves me a bit anxious. It's also a foreign concept that someone or something can keep me from doing what I want. It seems like a portion of my freedom has been removed. But more patience is warranted, and a little more time will be required. Once again, I forgot it's not about me, but about others and what's best for them. COVID-19 is impacting all of our lives at this time, but it doesn't have to control our every moment. We should take this time to reflect on the one who sent His Son at the perfect time, to the perfect place, to save us from our sin and death.

Letters were written and read to the parents explaining the food is provided to them through Christ's love during this coronavirus pandemic.


