Dear friends of Trinity,

Who would have thought that we would not have Holy Week, Easter, Advent and Christmas services as we always have? COVID has truly changed how we do things, and change offers a good opportunity to think about what we do and why we do it to begin with.

Has the coronavirus affected the nearness of God? The Lord is always near. The One who knows the stars by name and spoke the universe into being is always near to us. He invited ancient Israel to come into his presence. The Law made them keep their distance, but even in those days, God said, "Be strong and courageous. Do not be afraid or terrified because of them, for the LORD your God



goes with you; he will never leave you nor forsake you" Deuteronomy 31:6 (NIV)/Hebrews 13:5). Our sins separate us from God (Isaiah 59:2), but, when Jesus came, he revealed the Father's will. He bore our sins and urges us to "approach God's throne of grace with confidence, so that we may receive mercy and find grace to help us in our time of need" (Hebrews 4:16, NIV). The world needs to sense and know the comfort of God's presence, and, ironically, God can use even the coronavirus to renew the faith of those who put their hope in Christ.

Has the coronavirus affected the wonder of God's name? We can still recite, rehearse, celebrate, and demonstrate the acts, works, deeds, promises, character and attributes of our God. Notice the emphasis that King David uses with regard to our heavenly Father's name: "I will exalt you, my God the King; I will praise your name for ever and ever. <sup>2</sup> Every day I will praise you and extol your name for ever and ever. <sup>3</sup> Great is the LORD and most worthy of praise; his greatness no one can fathom" (Psalm 145:1-3, NIV). We should know and make remembrance of his Name by praising him, admiring him, and ascribing to him all of the great and wonderful things that he has done and continues to do on a daily basis. From generation to generation and from age to age God is near, and his love and mercy cannot be measured nor diminished.

Has the coronavirus affected the power of God? We are too inexperienced in life to be without a guide. God's Word is that guide. The whole of Psalm 119 unfolds assorted blessings and truths of God's Word. It shows how God's Word will assist us in the diversity of life's circumstances. But no single verse of all the Bible highlights this more clearly than verse 105, which shows how God's Word lights the way, giving direction for each step ("to my feet") and giving wisdom to our paths. Do not hasten ahead without it—ever. The power of God is not found in ourselves or in our strength, but in the promises of God, which He never fails to fulfil. What better year or time than now to let God's Word light our way? Jesus, the Word became flesh, was filled with compassion, healing and hope. The "light" of the Bible provides us a loving direction to Christ our hope.

God's name is still great. God's Word directs our way. And God is near. Christmas reminds us that God came near! I think we are left with a choice. We can dwell on what the COVID epidemic has changed for us in terms of how we have always done things. We can lament that it has disrupted our normal routines. But, then again, if we draw near to God, we will see that he is close to us. He will lift our hearts and minds with hope. We will be a witness of who God is in the midst of a world that doesn't know him, as his holy people have been from generation to generation.


Joy to the World - the Lord has come!





## **Keep It Real Simple - Love God Love People**

The Christmas story never gets old. The story is an account of the greatest gift ever. The gift that keeps on giving, and that same gift which never changes! The Christmas Story and the season of Advent is about the relationship between God and his people. We are his people. He claims us as His own!

## President's Monthly Report to the Congregation

Thank you for those of you who attended the Regular Voters' Meeting on Sunday, November 22, 2020. Here are some highlights that are based on my notes from the meeting. The official minutes will be ready soon.

To begin, we adopted a flat budget for calendar year 2021 that is based on revenue and spending estimates from the 2020 budget.

In addition, our Treasurer and the chair of the Capital Campaign Committee, David Lange, reported as of November 22, which was the deadline for the campaign, that we had pledges of about \$1.3 million. If you missed the deadline, it is not too late to make your pledge for the building project! If you have questions about how to make your pledge, please contact Mike Campo at the Trinity Office by calling (217) 367-8923.

Based on the encouraging pledge campaign report, the Building Committee will meet on December 3 to restart planning for the building project. The committee, which is chaired by David Kuehn, will report back to the congregation on their recommendations for us no later than the next regular Voters' Assembly in May 2021. If they are ready sooner, then I will call a special Voters' Assembly as soon as possible.

Our preschoolers completed a service project in November. We challenged our students to help at home and earn money to donate to our "Giving Jar". - Delivered into the hands of children through local churches, every shoebox gift is an opportunity to share about Jesus Christ and God's love.






