

Allow me to introduce myself. My name is Nic Fonner, a church member and latest addition to the Elders of Trinity Lutheran Church. I, together with my wife Martha and two sons Jonah (16) and Quinn (12) and daughter Maeve (10) attend worship service on Saturday evenings.

The Cliffs Notes version of my life sums to being raised in an LCMS family that pushed me to make myself "physically strong, mentally awake, and morally straight" to borrow a bit from the Scout Oath I so often repeat as the leader of the local cub scout pack 12.

The slightly longer version starts in the early 80s with my passion for sports like wrestling, football, baseball and strength training. I was and am a very driven person from youth T-ball throughout high school as a multi-sport athlete up until a major knee injury in baseball of all sports sidelined me. Thus ended my grand delusion that sports alone would carry me to success in life.

My focus quickly turned from physical pursuits to academic pursuits culminating in a master's degree in architecture from Clemson University in South Carolina in 2008. I was well positioned (or so I told my pregnant wife) to enter the building industry just as the housing market collapsed and a recession closed many previously open doors. We struggled with the help of family to get through those first several months with a newborn in tow, but I eventually gained a foothold in the Champaign-Urbana market. The rest is history, or so I thought.

Like many young fathers that devote themselves to the material wellbeing of their families, I <u>slowly</u> realized that I was not adequately providing in terms of a religious and moral upbringing for our three growing children. My faith, the most important pillar, needed reinforcing to avoid casting seeds onto rocky ground or amongst the thorns as Jesus warned in the Parable of the Sower. I needed to be intentional with my aim and prepare good soil for them.

This adventure is an ongoing trek and although I am far from out of the woods, I continue to pursue God's will along a narrow footpath. We officially hit the trail when we enrolled Quinn and then Maeve into Wee Disciples Preschool at Trinity back in 2016. We reached a major milestone in December of 2023 when my children were baptized. Jonah has also been confirmed, something that Quinn and Maeve will pursue in the coming years. All along, I have made time to read to them from the Bible to show them that faith is not a performative act and must be practiced daily with purpose not as a means of salvation but as a result of a sincerely held belief.

As an Elder at Trinity, I now find myself in an opportunity to serve a group much larger than my family or scouting organization. I pray that the Holy Spirit guides me to respond to the needs of this congregation with love, wisdom and in a manner that praises Jesus Christ.
