

Changes That Come in Our Lives

Adam and Eve were evicted from their home in the Garden of Eden and had to bear the pain of childbirth and hard work toiling in the soil for their food. The death of their son Abel was another unwanted change.

The world had gotten so evil that God took the only righteous family and had them build a huge boat. They were ridiculed while building the boat by everyone for over a hundred years. Then came the flood and the earth had changed. There is only Noah and his Family.

Abraham lived in what was considered a modern city. Then God had him become a nomad and live in a tent, moving him all over the place. Then God was going to destroy the town where his nephew Lot lived because it was full of evil. Because of Abraham's praying, Lot and his daughters were saved from the destruction.

Jacob had twelve sons, eleven of whom did not like Joseph since he was Jacob's favorite. They devised a plan to get rid of him and threw him in a well to die.

LWML CID Mission Grant #8 – Bible Storybooks for Ghana's Children

The mission field in Ghana is unique in that many Muslim children attend Lutheran grade schools to receive a quality education and 80% of the country's adults are illiterate. Ghanian pastors want to use Lutheran books in that education. Funds will be sent to Lutheran Heritage Foundation for the translation and subsequent printing of 'A child's Garden of Bible Stories' and Luther's Small Catechism. *Pray that God provides/uses these books to help the Ghana children and adults to become Christian.*

Treasurer's Report: Our Net Income shows a deficit of around \$7648. With the Lenten and Easter season upon us, hopefully, we will make up this deficit. As indicated above large donations were made and will be paid on that balance. In addition, a special payment from the Lutheran Church Extension Fund will also go towards the Building Fund.
